

CONTRIBUTE: We will leverage our legacy to maximize the strategic contribution of Catholic healthcare.


SERVE

For Aboriginal Health Liaison Worker Marlene Collins, a prayer, a hug and a song can go a long way to helping heal patients at the Bonnyville Health Centre. By introducing Aboriginal traditions such as smudge ceremonies with elders, Marlene helps build trust and a caring relationship between staff and First Nations' patients. Patients feel they can confide in Marlene in situations they might otherwise be uncomfortable, improving their chances for recovery.



Unexplained blurred vision and small strokes led Eva Jensen's physician to refer her to the Northern Alberta Vascular Centre (NAVC) at the Grey Nuns Community Hospital. After life-saving surgery to correct a blocked artery in her neck, Eva has endless energy and feels young again. An aging population in Alberta, northern BC and the Northwest Territories and a growing need for less invasive surgery has increased the demand for this life-altering procedure.

A fun activity for seniors in four long-term care facilities was the catalyst for a community interaction never seen before at the Killam Health Centre. Residents from Castor, Galahad, Killam and Hardisty care facilities competed in teams in a Seniors' Olympics. Families, staff and Killam's mayor cheered on and podium finishers proudly displayed their athletic achievements for weeks after the closing ceremonies.



Significant amounts included in Other: utilities, food and dairy supplies, building rent, housekeeping, other clinical supplies, building and grounds expense, equipment expense, office supplies, travel, minor equipment purchases, insurance, license, fees, memberships, education and telecommunications, interest on long-term debt.

Covenant Health met or exceeded its activity targets as established in the Cooperation and Services agreement with Alberta Health Services and ended the 2014/15 fiscal year in a favourable financial position. Covenant Health made investments in ongoing operations and to support our strategic priorities. We responded to the need for additional capacity by opening new beds in Edmonton and Lethbridge, and by increasing service levels to meet demands across the province, particularly in our Edmonton hospitals.
