

## Killam Health Centre

Killam Health Centre first began when the Sisters of St. Joseph renovated a brick house into a hospital in 1930. The Sisters served through a number of challenges, including staffing shortages during the Second World War and epidemics.

The last of the Sisters retired in 2003, but their commitment to treating each person with dignity and respect is carried forward by staff today, who provide residents of Flagstaff County with acute and continuing care.


