



Mary Immaculate Care Centre, Mundare

Four Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate made the journey from Western Ukraine to Edmonton in 1902, where they ministered to the sick. In 1903 they opened a convent in the Mundare district, where they began an orphanage and school and cared for the sick.

The Sisters officially opened Mary Immaculate Hospital in Mundare in 1929, where they served through food shortages and epidemics, working tirelessly to care for people in the community. To better serve the population's needs, the hospital was transitioned to a care centre, where staff now live the Sisters' legacy by providing compassionate care to seniors while honouring the care centre's Ukrainian Catholic history.
